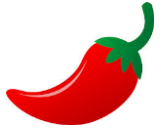

Thomas kept a record of the different pieces of fruit he ate in a month. Use his information to create a pictogram. Take care when looking at the key.



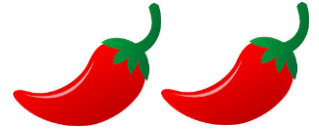
